1837 Michigan is admitted as the 26th U.S. state.

1838 Tennessee enacts the first prohibition law in the United States.

1861 The State of Louisiana secedes from the Union.

1870 Virginia rejoins the Union

1911 Richard Strauss' opera *Der Rosenkavalier* receives its debut performance at the Dresden State Opera.

1920 Former Ford Motor Company executive Henry Leland launches the Lincoln Motor Company, which he later sold to his former employer.

1961 John F. Kennedy appoints Janet G. Travell to be his physician. This is the first time a woman holds this appointment.

1962 Ranger 3 is launched to study the moon. The space probe later misses the moon by 22,000 miles (35,400 km).

1998 U.S. President Bill Clinton denies having had "sexual relations" with former White House intern Monica Lewinsky.

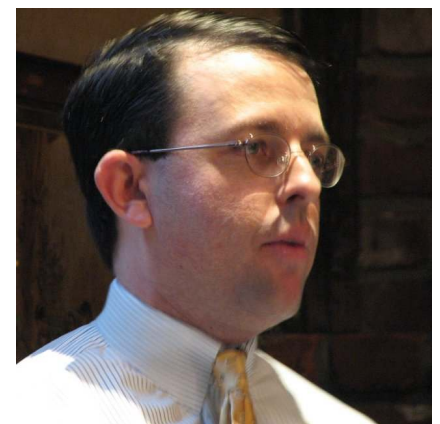
[Rotary Classroom Library](#)

Jason Shore

Cynthia Cowell introduced Jason Shore, Chairman of the Library Foundation, here to speak to us today about the Library Lecture Series. The following is the calendar for this season:

February 19, 2010 - David Sanger, Chief Washington Correspondent for The New York Times, David Sanger writes compelling front-page analyses from the White House and around the globe that explain the most complex events of our time.

March 26, 2010 - Frances Mayes has always adored houses, and when she saw Bramasole, a neglected, 200-year old Tuscan farmhouse, it was love at first sight. Out of that instant infatuation has come four marvelous, and hugely popular, books including the bestsellers *Under the Tuscan Sun* and *Bella Tuscany*.

April 16, 2010 - Social and media theorist and author Douglas Rushkoff is one of today's most engaging and perceptive commentators on the impact of technology and media on organizations and society. A globally recognized thought leader on marketing and Internet culture, he explores how communications affect our lives.

May 14, 2010 - David A. Kessler, M.D. is the former Commissioner of the United States Food and Drug Administration, serving from 1990 until 1997. He has also served as the Dean of the medical schools at Yale and U.C. San Francisco. He is now Professor of Pediatrics, Epidemiology and Biostatistics at UCSF. Kessler reinvented the food label and tackled the tobacco industry.

Mr. Shore told us how speakers are picked, i.e. topics and economics are large factors. The average

speaker gets \$20,000 so they like to pick diverse speakers.
