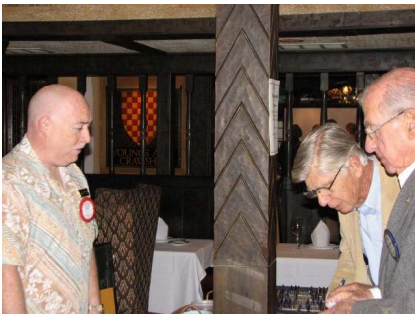
President Mary Cockley rang the bell at 7:30 AM to open the February 10, 2009 meeting.

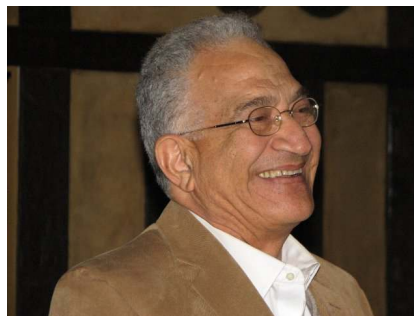
Get-Well Wishes and Prayers

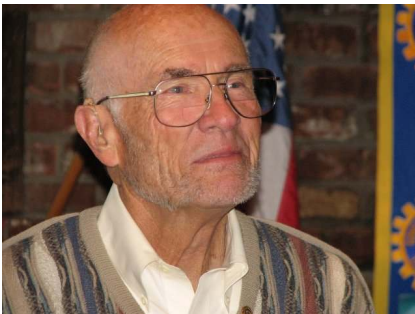
Marine Thank You
