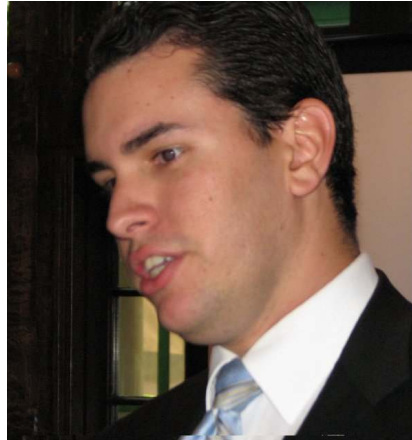
Fines

Gloria has traveled to 130 countries during her lifetime and has written a book entitled “Tuxedo Junction” “The Lords of Antarctica”. She showed us a DVD on the wonderful Emperor penguins. Her first trip to see the penguins was in 1991. In 2003 there were 16,000 tourists and in 2008 the number was up to 20,000. She was 77 years old when the film we saw was made.
