### On this Day

President Tim Brown enlightened us with the following milestones that occurred on May 11th:

**1502** - Christopher Columbus leaves for his fourth and final voyage to the West Indies.

**1820** - Launch of HMS *Beagle*, the ship that took Charles Darwin on his scientific voyage.

**1858**- Minnesota is admitted as the 32nd U.S. State.

**1910** – An act of the U.S. Congress establishes Glacier National Park in Montana.

**1924** – Mercedes-Benz is formed by Gottlieb Daimler and Karl Benz merging their two companies.

**1927** - The Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences is founded.

**1949** - Siam officially changes its name to Thailand for the second

time. The name had been in use since 1939 but was reverted.

**1960** - In Buenos Aires, Argentina, four Israeli Mossad agents capture fugitive Nazi Adolf Eichmann who is living under the alias of Ricardo Klement.

**1997** - IBM Deep Blue, a chess-playing supercomputer, defeats Garry Kasparov in the last game of the rematch, becoming the first computer to beat a world-champion chess player in a classic match format.

### Club Sponsored Marine Program

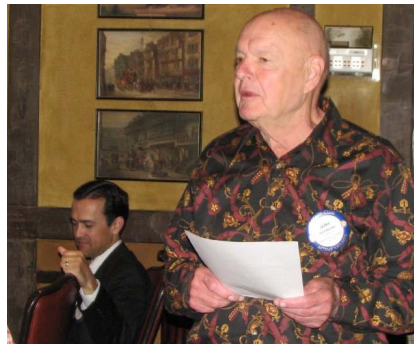

These programs are sponsored by the Marines, and supported by our Rotary Club. On **June 10, 2010** at Camp Pendleton Oceanside California a similar training will be held for 1000 Marines. The program will start with a presentation by Sgt. Major Bradley Kasal who was awarded the Navy Cross for conspicuous gallantry for action in Fallujah. You are all invited.



Sgt. Major Kasal received serious injuries, including seven rounds from an AK47 and shrapnel injuries sustained when he protected a fellow injured Marine from further wounds when a grenade was thrown into the building by throwing himself over the wounded Marine. He will be

speaking about coming home after battle and readjusting to life at home. Any club members who are interested in attending the conference please write to Pam Iles and let her know so that she can give you instructions on how to get to the building on base. The program starts promptly at 8:00AM (you know the Marines they are always on time). There will be some of our finest young men and women in that room and it is a chance to meet and greet these heroes in person and see who is fighting for us. There will be a small reception in the Officers lounge adjacent to the meeting room at 7:20 am coffee will be served.

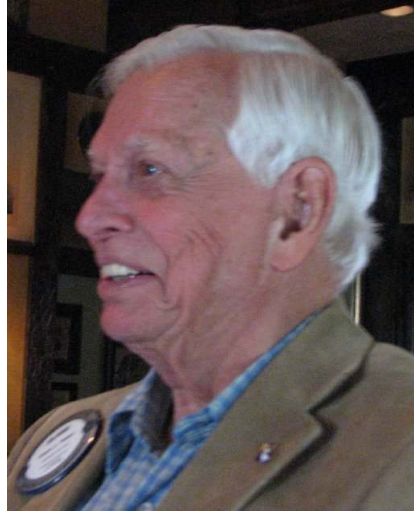
